

Tudor Hat

You will need:

4mm needles

Sewing needle

DK yarn - any colour of your choice

Abbreviations:

K – Knit

P – Purl

KFB - Knit in the front and back of stitch

K2tog - Knit two stitches together

Hat brim

Cast on 28 stitches

Rows 1 & 2: (K2, P2) repeat to end

Hat increase

Row 3: K2, KFB, knit 22, KFB, K2 (30 stitches)

Row 4: Purl

Row 5: K2, KFB, knit 24, KFB, K2 (32 stitches)

Row 6: Purl

Row 7: K2, KFB, knit 26, KFB, K2 (34 stitches)

Row 8: Purl

Row 9: K2, KFB, knit 28, KFB, K2 (36 stitches)

Row 10: Purl

Hat crown

Row 11: (Knit 4, K2tog) repeat to end (30 stitches)

Row 12: Purl

Row 13: (Knit 3, K2tog) repeat to end (24 stitches)

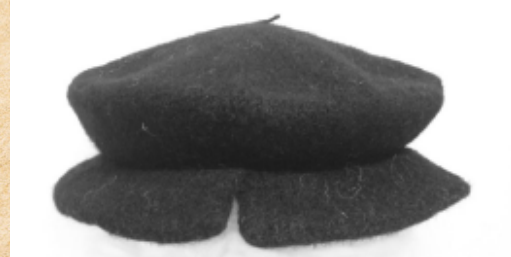
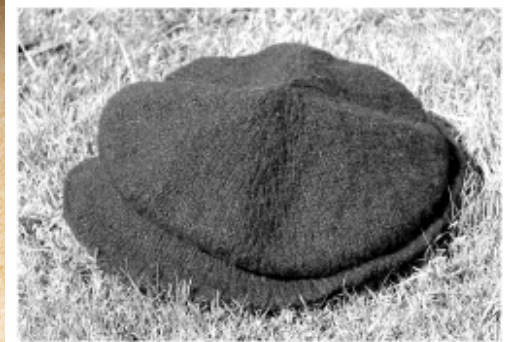
Row 14: Purl

Row 15: (Knit 2, K2tog) repeat to end (18 stitches)

Row 16: Purl

Row 17: K2tog to end (9 stitches)

Cut the yarn leaving a 10cm tail. Using sewing needle, pull remaining yarn tightly through the remaining stitches and sew up the sides. Press the hat slightly to sharpen the curves and get the distinctive shape.



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
