Teachers and adults are kindly requested to work in partnership with the museum team to actively supervise young people on site. **Pupils remain the responsibility of the school or group throughout the visit**, including during workshops, in the museum and at lunch time. The Museum has full evacuation procedures in case of emergency or fire. Please ensure that your group understands the importance of following such procedures in the event of an evacuation.

This identification sheet is designed to help you to complete a risk assessment for your visit to the Mary Rose Museum and Stavros Niarchos Foundation Learning Centre. **It does not replace your own risk assessment.** Columns 1 to 3 identify the hazards and controls put in place by the Museum. You may wish to use column 4 to help you highlight areas where your school should implement its own measures. **Please remember that the competence, behaviour and any special needs of your students should be taken into consideration when planning supervision and activities within the Museum.**

We strongly recommend that group leaders conduct a pre-visit in order to assess any potential risks for your group. **Free entry** is available for this purpose. To complete a pre-visit of the attractions, please bring your booking reference number with you on whichever day you decide to come. Please go to the group check-in desk and quote your reference number and you will be given up to 3 complimentary tickets. If you are visiting at the weekend or during school holidays, we offer one complimentary family ticket.
